Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The objective of the Mawer EAFE Large Cap Fund (the "Fund") is to achieve above-average long-term risk-adjusted returns and to create a diversified portfolio of equity and equity related securities of larger companies located in developed countries outside of Canada and the United States, primarily in Europe, Australasia and the Far East (EAFE). This is done by choosing companies that we believe will be wealth-creating in the long term and are trading at a discount to their intrinsic value. We prefer companies with enduring competitive advantages that will allow them to earn a return greater than their cost of capital over the long term. The Fund has a long-term buy and hold strategy and seeks to keep turnover low.

Risk

The risk level of the Fund did not change during the year. This Fund is suitable for investors seeking long-term growth and who have a medium risk tolerance. General risks of investing in this Fund are outlined in the Prospectus and include the possibility of reduction in value of any given investment, liquidity risk, interest rate risk and currency risk amongst others.

The Manager attempts to reduce the exposure to these risks by not concentrating more than 20% of the net assets of the Fund in a particular Industry as defined by the Global Industry Classification Standards (GICS). The Manager provides diversification of risk by investing primarily in equity and equity related securities of larger companies located in developed countries outside of Canada and the United States, primarily in Europe, Australasia and the Far East (EAFE).

Results of Operations

The Fund's net assets increased 21.0% to \$123.9 million from \$102.4 million at December 31, 2025. Of this change, \$18.2 million is attributable to positive investment performance and \$3.3 million was due to net contributions to the Fund.

The Manager assesses the Fund's underlying securities for liquidity on a quarterly basis. During the period the Fund has remained in compliance with National Instrument 81-102 and has maintained an illiquid concentration of less than 10% of the Fund's Net Asset Value. During the period there were no notable redemptions to the Fund that affected its liquidity.

Performance Overview

Over the twelve-month period, the Fund's Series A Units' return was 15.9% (after fees and expenses) compared to the MSCI EAFE Index (Net) return of 25.1%. All performance values provided are in Canadian dollar terms. Markets were supported by optimism related to artificial intelligence, while more traditionally value-oriented sectors such as Financials and Materials also performed well, benefiting from steepening yield curves and robust precious metal prices, respectively.

Key Contributors and Detractors

In terms of relative performance, negative security selection was responsible for underperformance. Sector allocation was marginally positive over the period. At the security level, some of the largest detractors were among the Fund's best long-term compounders. Wolters Kluwer NV declined amid a sentiment shift related to artificial-intelligence concerns. Bunzl plc, a recurring consumables distributor, fell sharply due to increased competition and internal execution challenges. Shares of Novo Nordisk A/S retreated as changing competitive dynamics and execution-related setbacks weighed on investor confidence.

On the positive side, defense-related holdings were notable contributors. Rheinmetall AG and BAE Systems plc generated strong returns as rising European defense spending and a rapidly evolving geopolitical environment materially increased demand expectations. Both companies benefit from entrenched customer relationships, mission-critical offerings, and high barriers to entry created through decades of consolidation and underinvestment.

Financials comprised a meaningful share of portfolio initiations during the period. Intesa Sanpaolo S.p.A., Italy's largest bank and wealth manager, was initiated based on its low-cost deposit franchise and favourable positioning within a consolidating domestic market. NatWest Group plc was added to gain exposure to improving banking fundamentals in the United Kingdom, supported by a more attractive yield curve environment. A position was also initiated in Itochu Corporation, a Japanese trading company with a long operating history, reflecting its disciplined capital allocation, governance improvements, and focus on higher-return, lower-cyclicality business areas.

Portfolio Activity

Notable eliminations included IMCD N.V. and JDE Peet's N.V. IMCD was removed due to weakening fundamental momentum across several end markets, while JDE Peet's was exited following management changes, recent capital allocation decisions, and increasing pressure from more price-sensitive consumers.

Market Outlook

At the end of 2025, investors were navigating a complex mix of optimism and uncertainty. The combination of artificial intelligence innovation, continued fiscal support, and gradually easing monetary policy had supported growth and market confidence longer than many anticipated.

Beneath the surface, however, the global environment was evolving. Shifting geopolitical alliances, increased policy intervention, and a growing emphasis on economic security accelerated the transition toward a more fragmented and multipolar world. Trade was increasingly being rerouted through trusted corridors, and supply chains were being redesigned with greater emphasis on resilience.

In such an environment, differences in management quality, balance-sheet discipline, governance, and capital allocation were expected to play an increasingly important role in determining long-term outcomes. The Fund remained focused on businesses capable of sustaining value creation while guarding against the permanent impairment of capital.

Recent Developments

There are no recent developments to report related to the strategic positioning of the Fund, the Manager, or the policies of the Independent Review Committee.

Related Party Transactions – Management Fees

The Portfolio Advisor receives management fees of 1.10% per annum for Series A Units of the Fund. The management fee is calculated daily at the rate of 1/365 (or 1/366 in a leap year) as the percentage of aggregate net asset value of the Series A Units of the Fund as of the last Valuation Date. The fee accrues daily and is paid monthly in arrears. Management fees for Series O Units are payable directly to the Manager by Series O investors and not by the Fund.

The Manager of the Fund has the ability, at their discretion, to reduce the management fees for large investors. This reduction is effected by means of a management fee distribution and will be automatically reinvested in additional units of the Fund at the net asset value of the Fund on the date of distribution. Mawer also receives fees for performing administrative services. As at December 31, 2025 the Fund owes Mawer \$0 related to these administrative services.

⁽²⁾ Management expense ratio is based on total expenses for the stated year and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the year. The Manager, at its discretion, absorbed certain expenses otherwise payable by each Series. ⁽³⁾ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the year.

⁽⁴⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's Portfolio Advisors manage its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. 
The Fund's performance numbers assume that all distributions are reinvested in additional units of the Fund. If you hold this Fund outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions that are paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional units. The amount of the reinvested taxable distributions is added to the adjusted cost base of the units that you own. This would decrease your capital gains or increase your capital loss when you later redeem from the Fund, thereby ensuring that you are not taxed on this amount again. Year-by-Year Returns


