Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The investment objective of the Mawer Canadian Equity Fund (the "Fund") is to invest for above average long-term returns in equity securities of Canadian companies. In order to achieve its investment objectives, the Manager systematically creates a broadly diversified portfolio of wealth-creating companies with excellent management teams bought at discounts to their intrinsic values. The Manager employs a highly disciplined, research-driven, bottom-up process and long-term holding period to allow for investor recognition or corporate growth, and to minimize transaction costs.

Risk

The risk level of the Fund did not change during the year. The Fund is suitable for investors seeking long-term growth and who have a medium tolerance for risk. General risks of investing in the Fund are outlined in the Prospectus and include the possibility of reduction in value of any given stock, liquidity risk, interest rate risk and currency risk, among others.

The Manager reduces the exposure to these risks by not concentrating more than 20% of the net assets of the Fund in a particular industry (i.e., sub-sector) as defined by the Global Industry Classification Standards (GICS).

Results of Operations

The Fund's net assets decreased 0.2% to \$4,034.8 million from \$4,042.0 million at June 30, 2026. Of this change, \$319.4 million is attributable to positive investment performance and -\$326.6 million was due to net redemptions to the Fund.

The Manager assesses the Fund's underlying securities for liquidity on a quarterly basis. During the period the Fund has remained in compliance with National Instrument 81-102 and has maintained an illiquid concentration of less than 10% of the Fund's Net Asset Value. During the period there were no notable redemptions to the Fund that affected its liquidity.

Performance Overview

Over the six-month period, the Fund's Series F units (formerly Series A) returned 7.6% after fees and expenses, compared to the S&P/TSX Composite Index (Gross) return of 11.2%. All performance figures are presented in Canadian dollars. When assessing relative performance, security selection was negative, particularly in Financials. This was partially offset by positive sector allocation.

Key Contributors and Detractors

At the security level, Financials were a strong positive source of absolute return in the portfolio. The holdings in The Toronto-Dominion Bank, Royal Bank of Canada, and Bank of Montreal gained particularly in the second quarter due to expanding net interest margins, strong capital markets activity, good wealth management results from higher stock markets, and resilient credit quality.

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Despite the Fund's overweight to the financial sector contributing to positive relative value, the underweight to banks in favour of a more diversified basket of financial holdings detracted from relative returns.

The familiar theme of strong performance from the two Caterpillar equipment dealers, Finning International Inc. and Toromont Industries Ltd., also continued. Data-centre demand was a notable driver with both companies benefiting from the servicing of power systems and construction equipment for data centres.

The primary underperforming stocks in the portfolio have been software business models which are being pressured by AI enthusiasm. These include Shopify Inc., an e-commerce software provider; Constellation Software Inc. and Topicus.com Inc., vertical market software providers; and CGI Inc., an IT consulting firm.

Portfolio Activity

Over the past six months, we made notable additions to the portfolio. A position was initiated in TC Energy Corporation, a North American energy infrastructure company. We anticipate strong runway for mid-single digit growth through 2030 as the company sees strong demand across North American gas pipelines which connect to export terminals, as well as Bruce Power.

Another position was initiated in Celestica Inc., a provider of electronics manufacturing and supply chain solutions, which has established a strong position in switching and networking equipment, with exposure to customers such as Google and Broadcom. We believe the company is well placed to benefit from continued AI-related capital spending, including demand tied to networking infrastructure and Tensor Processing Units.

Meanwhile, some of the notable eliminations from the portfolio included convenience store operator Alimentation Couche-Tard Inc., Canadian National Railway Company, a rail and transportation company, and Hammond Power Solutions Inc., a manufacturer of dry-type transformers, in favour of better opportunities elsewhere.

Market Outlook

With the World Cup upon us, a soccer analogy feels timely. A winning team does not field eleven of the same position. Each player has a job, and how they work together matters as much as any individual's brilliance. A team built to win over a full season needs players for every role and every condition: goal scorers undoubtedly, but also midfielders who control the run of play and defenders who keep the ball out of the net when the opposition presses.

Over the past few years, Canadian equity investors would have been well rewarded by focusing on banks, commodity producers, and a couple of technology stocks. The index is getting very concentrated with a small handful of forces pulling the market along, and in many cases making portfolios that are not fielding an overabundance of one or two positions look silly by comparison.

Markets have always produced a small number of big winners, with the distribution of corporate success lopsided by nature: finance professor Hendrik Bessembinder's fascinating research covering a century of stock price returns demonstrates that there is a profound skewness in individual stock returns, with a relatively small proportion of companies driving the lion's share of the overall market's wealth-creation over the long term.

The lesson we draw from this is not that one should chase whatever is winning; rather, we have been selective and disciplined: identifying terrific, wealth-creating companies when the odds were favourable and carefully managing position sizes thereafter.

But this brings the discussion back to the rest of the team. The businesses that have appeared dull of late (think: exchanges and data companies that benefit from strong network effects and grocers that simply keep compounding) are not players we have forgotten to substitute. They are on the pitch by design. Their ballast carries a cost in a market currently shaped by a few extraordinary winners. But we regard it as a price worth paying.

In investing, matches are not won by the side that attacks most furiously for only twenty minutes, nor by the one so afraid of conceding that it never ventures forward. Both are required.

Recent Developments

Mawer's Series A mutual funds have been renamed to Series F effective May 27th, 2026. Fund codes and all other fund attributes, including terms, conditions, and fees will remain unchanged.

Related Party Transactions – Management Fees

The Portfolio Advisor receives management fees of 1.00% per annum for Series F (formerly Series A) Units of the Fund. The management fee is calculated daily at the rate of 1/365 (or 1/366 in a leap year) as the percentage of aggregate net asset value of the Series F (formerly Series A) Units of the Fund as of the last Valuation Date. The fee accrues daily and is paid monthly in arrears. Management fees for Series O Units are payable directly to the Manager by Series O investors and not by the Fund.

The Manager of the Fund has the ability, at their discretion, to reduce the management fees for large investors. This reduction is effected by means of a management fee distribution and will be automatically reinvested in additional units of the Fund at the net asset value of the Fund on the date of distribution. Mawer also receives fees for performing administrative services. As at June 30, 2026 the Fund owes Mawer \$0 related to these administrative services.

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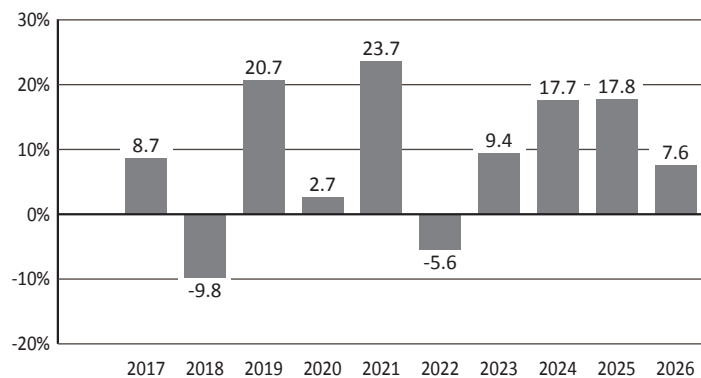
The Fund's performance numbers assume that all distributions are reinvested in additional units of the Fund. If you hold this Fund outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions that are paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional units. The amount of the reinvested taxable distributions is added to the adjusted cost base of the units that you own. 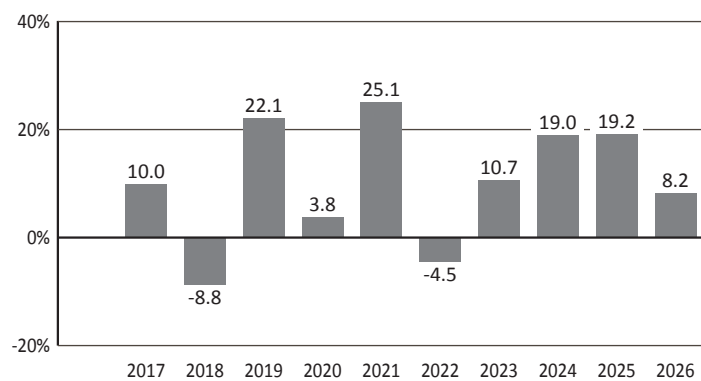
Year-by-Year Returns
