Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The objective of the Mawer EAFE Large Cap Fund (the "Fund") is to achieve above-average long-term risk-adjusted returns and to create a diversified portfolio of equity and equity related securities of larger companies located in developed countries outside of Canada and the United States, primarily in Europe, Australasia and the Far East (EAFE). This is done by choosing companies that we believe will be wealth-creating in the long term and are trading at a discount to their intrinsic value. We prefer companies with enduring competitive advantages that will allow them to earn a return greater than their cost of capital over the long term. The Fund has a long-term buy and hold strategy and seeks to keep turnover low.

Risk

The risk level of the Fund did not change during the year. This Fund is suitable for investors seeking long-term growth and who have a medium risk tolerance. General risks of investing in this Fund are outlined in the Prospectus and include the possibility of reduction in value of any given investment, liquidity risk, interest rate risk and currency risk amongst others.

The Manager attempts to reduce the exposure to these risks by not concentrating more than 20% of the net assets of the Fund in a particular Industry as defined by the Global Industry Classification Standards (GICS). The Manager provides diversification of risk by investing primarily in equity and equity related securities of larger companies located in developed countries outside of Canada and the United States, primarily in Europe, Australasia and the Far East (EAFE).

Results of Operations

The Fund's net assets increased 17.6% to \$120.4 million from \$102.4 million at June 30, 2025. Of this change, \$13.1 million is attributable to positive investment performance and \$4.9 million was due to net contributions to the Fund.

The Manager assesses the Fund's underlying securities for liquidity on a quarterly basis. During the period the Fund has remained in compliance with National Instrument 81-102 and has maintained an illiquid concentration of less than 10% of the Fund's Net Asset Value. During the period there were no notable redemptions to the Fund that affected its liquidity.

Performance Overview

Over the past six months, the Fund's Series A Units returned 11.8% (net of fees and expenses), compared to the MSCI EAFE Index return of 13.3%. All performance values provided are in Canadian dollar terms. Security selection detracted from performance, particularly within Financials and Communication Services, while strong results in Industrials helped offset some of these challenges.

Key Contributors and Detractors

A notable detractor was Bunzl plc, a recurring consumables distributor, which declined sharply following a profit warning. Management attributed the setback to increased competition and internal execution issues. Historically regarded as a high-quality management team, Bunzl's leadership is believed to be taking decisive action to address these challenges.

Several portfolio companies with significant U.S. exposure, such as Diageo plc and InterContinental Hotels Group plc, also faced headwinds. Both stocks pulled back as investors recalibrated expectations for U.S. economic growth and reacted to concerns about tariffs.

On the positive side, defense contractors Rheinmetall AG and BAE Systems plc delivered strong returns. Their shares benefited from heightened geopolitical uncertainty, expectations for increased European defense spending, and robust internal execution.

Portfolio Activity

During the period, we made several notable additions. We initiated a position in Intesa Sanpaolo S.p.A., Italy's largest bank and wealth manager. Intesa benefits from a low-cost deposit base and operates in a consolidating market. Its stable market share is supported by a conservative and loyal customer base, and its valuation remains attractive given a modest growth outlook and substantial capital returns to shareholders.

We also added BNP Paribas S.A., a leading European financial conglomerate. The environment for European banks is improving, supported by higher interest rates, industry consolidation, and a more favorable regulatory backdrop. BNP Paribas has strengthened its market position, particularly in investment banking, and continues to trade at an undemanding valuation.

Meanwhile, we exited our position in JDE Peet's N.V. to redeploy capital into more compelling opportunities.

Market Outlook

Despite many equity markets reaching or approaching all-time highs, the investment environment remains uncertain. Escalating tariff and trade tensions, persistent inflationary pressures, and evolving geopolitical risks continue to cloud the economic outlook. Secular trends such as deglobalization, protectionism, and increased government intervention are gaining momentum.

We liken the current environment to a four-way traffic stop: businesses and consumers are pausing, waiting for greater clarity before making significant decisions. This caution is likely to persist until there is more certainty around policy direction and economic conditions.

In this environment, we remain focused on investing in high-quality companies led by strong management teams—businesses we believe are well-positioned to navigate uncertainty, protect capital in downturns, and capitalize on emerging opportunities. Maintaining a diversified portfolio and prudent risk management are central to our approach as we adapt to new market dynamics.

Recent Developments

Effective December 31, 2024, Mr. Robert Kennedy retired from the Independent Review Committee (the "IRC"). Mr. Jerry Patava replaced Mr. Robert Kennedy on January 1, 2025.

Related Party Transactions – Management Fees

The Portfolio Advisor receives management fees of 1.10% per annum for Series A Units of the Fund. The management fee is calculated daily at the rate of 1/365 (or 1/366 in a leap year) as the percentage of aggregate net asset value of the Series A Units of the Fund as of the last Valuation Date. The fee accrues daily and is paid monthly in arrears. Management fees for Series O Units are payable directly to the Manager by Series O investors and not by the Fund.

The Manager of the Fund has the ability, at their discretion, to reduce the management fees for large investors. This reduction is effected by means of a management fee distribution and will be automatically reinvested in additional nits of the Fund at the net asset value of the Fund on the date of distribution. Mawer also receives fees for performing administrative services. As at June 30, 2025 the Fund owes Mawer \$0 related to these administrative services.

A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.


The Fund's performance numbers assume that all distributions are reinvested in additional units of the Fund. If you hold this Fund outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions that are paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional units. 
Year-by-Year Returns
